2018 Graduation Information for Parents/Seniors

Things to take care of right away: Check these off as soon as possible!

- **1**. Clear outstanding balances owed to the school district (bill included).
- 2. Have all of current text books ready to check in (list included with mailer). These MUST be turned in or cleared by 3:00 PM, Friday, June 1st to walk at graduation.
- 3. Save anything that the student has stored on the students google drive to a portable device. All seniors google space is deleted during the summer. Some students have resumes and other information stored there. It all goes away in July.
- 4. Check the deficiency list and the seating chart on the main office window DAILY as these change depending on issues being cleared or added.
- 5. ALL LATE WORK is due May 30th. Grades will be determined based on what you've completed and turned in by May 30th. We provide a couple of days (May 31 June 1) for any last minute credit recovery that must be done, but your normal course work must be turned in by the end of the day on May 30th.
- 6. MANDATORY graduation practice is June 5ht from 9:30 AM 1:00 PM. Plan for work and family obligations to be cleared for MANDATORY graduation practice. <u>This is not optional</u> – every senior who plans to walk at graduation MUST attend practice. Speak directly with Mr. Belveal if you have questions. Part of practice time will be our annual "Honor Walk" at the local elementary/middle schools.
- 7. Check the calendar of events below and clear obligations to be able to fully participate in the senior activities.
- 8. Students if there is any doubt of passing a class or you have any difficulty with required courses being taken at LBCC or other institution, PLEASE be in contact with your counselor. DON'T wait until the last second.
- 9. Credit Recovery: If you are working on credit recovery, NOW is the time to invest the time in getting this completed. All credit recovery is due by 3:00 PM on Friday, June 1st to walk at graduation. Please don't make everyone stress out by waiting until the last minute to complete all of your requirements.
- 10. PASS YOUR CLASSES! Senioritis can be a real thing don't let the excitement of the end of high school distract you from your classes – <u>attend every</u> <u>day</u>, <u>do the work</u>, take care of <u>passing your classes</u> so that we can celebrate on June 5th!
- 11. Order your final transcripts as needed for college admission. Order forms are in the counseling office, and they are returned to Mrs. Chipman with the \$2 fee.
- 12. Graduation Attire: Gentlemen -- long pants and dress shoes no exceptions. Graduation Attire: Ladies - long pants, dress, or skirt - no exceptions. Graduation Attire: All - no flip flops or sandals without securing straps.

Graduation Tickets will be issued at the Senior Breakfast<u>IF</u> you have cleared all deficiencies, paid all bills, fines, book fees, and are ready to graduate! Tickets are available from Mrs. Chipman in the counseling office after the Senior Breakfast <u>as soon as you have cleared</u> all deficiencies and are cleared for graduation.

<u>* Reserved Tickets</u>: Every student will receive 8 reserved section tickets. Reserved seating is in the front ½ of the hall, a reserved ticket will be required to enter this area. If your family does not need 8 seats, it would be INCREDIBLY helpful if you return any extras to Mrs. Chipman in the counseling office.

<u>* General Admission Tickets</u>: Requests can be made in the front office beginning on May 14th through May 25th for additional general admission tickets. Every effort is made to meet your needs, but we cannot exceed 4,000 total tickets. We do ask you to be as realistic as possible and may have to limit large requests. (We have met all reasonable requests each of the last seven years.)

<u>Friday, June 1st</u>
<u>3:00 PM</u> is the <u>absolute</u> deadline for any and all work to be completed and turned in, fees paid, and all details taken care of to walk at graduation. Any student who <u>has not met this deadline will not be</u> <u>allowed to walk</u> at graduation on Tuesday. This deadline is necessary for preparation for the ceremony.

You receive your graduation gown and mortar board at graduation practice and can gather or do whatever you would like to decorate. PLEASE be careful about supplies you use make sure you have fast drying glue/etc. so that it has time to dry and will stay together during the 3 hour ceremony. YES!
